1.0 CALL TO ORDER / ROLL CALL: Members Present and Absent Quorum

1.1 Mayor Jennings, Mayor Pro-Tem McKown, Alderman Greeson, Alderwoman Ramos - Absent, Alderman Hoskins - Absent, Alderman Bell.

2.0 PLEDGES OF ALLEGIANCE

3.0 SPECIAL PRESENTATIONS

3.1 Camilla with Linebarger stopped in to say hello and presented the updated report. The council having a few questions, Camilla answered and explained the report. No other questions.

4.0 COUNCIL REPORTS & REQUESTS

4.1 Mayor Jennings asks council members if anyone had any Reports or Requests to share with the community with all members present responding no.

5.0 PUBLIC HEARINGS & PUBLIC COMMENTS

5.1 Public Comments - None

This is an opportunity for the public to address the council. Dialogue, deliberation, or discussion, with council members on items that are not on the agenda is prohibited by law. Time for each speaker is limited to five minutes.

6.0 ADMINISTRATIVE REPORTS

6.1 **City Manager's Report** – Updates on city activities, staff, budget, public works, police.

Mr. Harrison went over the financial report as attached.

Mr. Greeson asked a few questions regarding the paying the debt for the road repair, Mr. Harrison advised yes this has been taken care of hence the reason for the Tex Pool account with a lower balance.

Mr. Greeson asked questions on the judicial Report and they Mayor answered advising we are still not losing money on Court and the numbers will continue to grow and the court will eventually break even.

The mayor suggested that if anyone had questions, to shoot an email over so the staff could be better prepared to answer the questions asked.

It was asked that the number of citations were down from previous months, Mr. Harrison explained that this is due to the officers being removed from Highway 146 to concentrate more on the streets of the city. This has been discussed and the officers will now be moving back to Highway 146 and the numbers should be going up.

Mr. Harrison commented on the parking lot for Shell Beach and how it has been completed, Limestone was poured and spread and is holding up well. Now will be placing some curb stops for marking the parking spots and there will be 13.

Mr. Greeson commented that it looks great, he has been down to the beach and looked around and noticed that there is some underbrush that needs to be cleaned as well as the driftwood that has been piled up in the underbrush. The mayor advised he has been looking for volunteers to come and help clean up down at the beach but has not had any response. Mr. Greeson advised to call him and let hm know.

Mr. Harrison advised that Heavy Trash starts Monday the 15th and maybe we can get this out and place it out before the trash comes.

Mr. Greeson advised that there is a dead tree on the west side of the circle that is dead and needs to be removed before it falls on a car. Mr. Harrison advised he would check on this.

Mr. McKown advised there are three houses in the city that the yards are in very bad shape advising the 2 on Shore Acres Blvd by City Hall and the police Department and one on Byway. Mr. Harrison advised that all three locations are in probate due to the deaths of the homeowners.

There being no questions and no discussion on the financial report, Mr. Harrison moved on to the next item.

6.2 Monthly Police Department Report. Harrison

Mr. Harrison advised it has been a typical month at the police department, adding there was a near close call with the near drowning of a young child. The officer was dispatched as well as Windsor being in the city. The child was found at the bottom of the pool and was pulled out, transported to the hospital where he spent the night for observation. All is well and the child is doing fine. Summer is approaching and we need to be aware of this with all the pools in the city.

Mr. Greeson asked about the Bank Service Charges and them being over budges 402%, it was explained that these fees are from the previous year audit and the assistance needed from the bank to get the documents needed to complete the audit. Discussion was held and suggested that possibly this needs to be moved to another category.

The mayor commented on Officer Ryan who came down to Shell Beach while he was there with a child he was watching and visited with and deputized him placing a badge on his shirt and giving him an extra one to take home. This really made his day and something he will remember for a long time. Mr. Harrison commented and advised we really do have a great group of Officers, the best we have ever had.

6.3 **Public Works Report.** Harrison

Mr. Harrison advised this month had been a slow month in Public Works with not many leaks and the last project started is not 100% complete. The water tanks have been drained and refilled and samples will be sent off. This project has taken 3-4 years to complete due to the Contractors.

Mr. Greeson advised that at Circle Park, there appears to be a water meter cover that has been possibly run over by a vehicle. Mr. Harrison advised he will look into this.

7.0 BUSINESS

7.1 **Approve Minutes** from the March 11, 2024, meeting. Goodman

Mayor Pro-Tem McKown made a motion to approve the minutes as written with a 2^{nd} from Alderman Greeson. There being no questions and/or discussion, the vote was taken, and the motion passed unanimously.

Mayor Jennings asked if it was necessary to have a second meeting. All council members, Ms. Goodman and Mr. Harrison, all replied no.

ORDINANCE NO. 2024-05-01 CITY OF SHOREACRES

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE SHOREACRES CITY CODE TO MOVE ZONING DISTRICT F, PRIVATE MARINE CLUB PARKING, INTO ZONING DISTRICT C, SINGLE FAMILY DWELLING; CONTAINING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; MAKING VARIOUS FINDINGS AND PROVISIONS RELATING TO THE SUBJECT; FINDING COMPLIANCE WITH THE OPEN MEETINGS LAW; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE HEREOF.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SHOREACRES:

Section 1. That the Planning and Zoning Commission of the City previously met at an open meeting on Tuesday, April 23, 2024 and voted by at least a majority vote to recommend the zoning change moving District F, Private Marine Club Parking into District C, Single Family Dwelling.

That Chapter 74, Zoning, of the Shoreacres City Code of Ordinances, City of Shoreacres, Texas, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Chapter 74 - ZONING

ARTICLE III. - DISTRICT REGULATIONS

DIVISION 1-GENERALLY

Secs. 74-131. - Zoning districts and zoning map.

- (4) Single-family dwelling district C (As of May 13, 2024 includes Blocks 22-27, Block 15, Shoreacres)
- (7) Private marine club parking-district F (Blocks 22-27, Block 15, Shoreacres)
- (8) (7) Single family dwelling district G (Block 34 lots 10-18 and Block 1 Lot 1)

Section 2. If any section, clause, sentence, or phrase of this Ordinance is held to be invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, then said holding shall in no way affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance; and,

Section 3. This Ordinance shall be effective from and after its passage and approval, and it is so ordered.

Section 4. The City Council officially finds, determines, recites, and declares that a sufficient written notice of the date, hour, place and subject of this meeting of the City Council was posted at a place convenient to the public at the City Hall of the City for the time required by law preceding this meeting, as required by the Open

Meetings Law, Chapter 551, Texas Government code; and that this meeting has been open to the public as required by law at all times during which this ordinance and the subject matter thereof has been discussed, considered and formally acted upon. The City Council further ratifies, approves, and confirms such written notice and the contents and posting thereof.

- Install traffic signs to block off and detour section of roadway where work is to be performed.
- Remove the three sections of roadway to get down to sewer main. For the point repair we will remove an 8'x8' section. The other two we will remove up to 8'x18' sections.
- Haul off asphalt and dispose of it.
- Excavate up to 11.5' and expose both sections of sewer main that the 10' section of main that is to be replaced. Install shoring box remove up to 10' of bad 8" Main and replace with new 8" SDR 26 pipe.
- Bed all new sewer main with stabilized sand and then backfill hole and then top off with stabilized sand for base for the new asphalt.
- For the 8'x8' cut-out dig down install shoring box remove broken house tap and re-do tap securely on sewer main if needed remove a 4' section of main and install new pipe with new tap. Stabilize repair and backfill top off with stabilized for new asphalt.
- o After repairs are made install new asphalt over cut out sections. And open back up roadway.
